

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE MOTT CITY COUNCIL**  
**May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2012**

Council met before the meeting for their annual spring tour of the city.

The Comprehensive Planning & Zoning with Gene Buresh of Roosevelt-Custer Regional Council was held prior to the regular council meeting at 7:30. Rod Landblom of Roosevelt-Custer Regional Council had also stopped in.

The Council met for their monthly scheduled meeting on May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2012. Present were Mosbrucker, Steiner, Zich, Scheeler, Wangsvick, Messmer and Riedlinger. Also present for the meeting were Sheriff Werner, Deputy Brian Eaton, Kurtis Burwick and Kerry Mosbrucker. All motions are carried, unless otherwise stated.

The meeting was called to order and Wangsvick moved to approve the previous minutes as presented, seconded by Scheeler.

Sheriff Werner gave the police report. Zich moved to accept police report as given, seconded by Steiner.

Kerry Mosbrucker gave the superintendent report. They have gotten the water and sewer lines connected for the new apartments and will be getting prepared to demolish the flood buyout buildings after getting approval from the state.

Messmer moved and Scheeler seconded designating "The Herald" as the city's official newspaper. Council read a letter requesting services be discontinued and to longer pay for them. Council again mentioned that if they come before council and show that it is a hardship, they may look into it more, but it will stand as is until then.

A letter was received from the Office of the State Engineer letting the council know that they had received our letter of disapproval regarding the appropriation of water for Vernon Mayer. The office will let us know of their decision at a later date.

Council discussed the spring tour. Auditor is to send letters to the residents that need clean up on their property.

Zich moved and Messmer seconded to have Concrete Specialties do some work on the waterway between the Tim Bieber and Ray Bieber properties.

Riedlinger moved and Steiner seconded the approval of the Special Alcohol Permit for Private Group submitted by Jeremy Vidmar and Kathleen Crane for wedding reception to be held at the Hettinger County Fairgrounds on July 21<sup>st</sup>.

Council would like City Attorney David Crane send a letter to Darrell Gobble regarding his property that is under contract for deed and he hasn't done the work on it that was requested in the contract.

Wangsvick moved and Scheeler seconded the approval of the gaming site permits received from M.O.T.T.
