

# PROCEEDINGS OF THE MOTT CITY COUNCIL

December 8, 2014

The Council met for their monthly scheduled meeting on Monday, December 8th, 2014. Present were Mayor Mosbrucker, Council members Steiner, Johnson, Wangsvick, Quamme, Riedlinger, and City Superintendent Mosbrucker. Also present was Sheriff Sarah Warner, Lori Eggers, Wilbert Herner, Lindsay Krebs, and John Wilczek. All motions are carried, unless otherwise stated.

Steiner moved and Quamme seconded the approval of the minutes from November's meeting.

Lindsay Krebs and John Wilczek were on hand from KLJ to review the water run off problem in the NW portion of town. Mr. Wilczek gave possible suggestions to keep the water from flooding the East end of 5<sup>th</sup> St. KLJ will present a list of options and costs at the next meeting.

Sheriff Warner was present the report for November. There were no ongoing investigations and overall Mott was quiet. Sheriff Warner will not be at the January meeting and will send Josh.

City Superintendent Mosbrucker shared the lagoon had been drained for winter. A burn permit was requested for all the wood at the landfill. The guys changed out a bad control valve in the water tower. The other valve needs replacing as well. Kerry will order it now knowing it takes about 8 weeks to arrive. Demolition has started on the Oscar Rogers house. The city had been looking for snow gate for our snow plow...no snow gate on the market will fit our plow. The city asked Stelter's for an estimate to create one which is \$6600. For the time being the city will take on additional help when needed to clear snow.

Johnson moved and Wangsvick seconded purchasing a truck mounted sand spreader. Wangsvick moved and Riedlinger seconded selling our current interest in the County's sand spreader for \$3000.00 back to the County. Johnson and K&K offered to haul the spreader from Fargo.

NDDOT had a public meeting at City Hall on Tuesday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>, to discuss the proposed work to be done on Hwys 8/21/22 from the 4-way stop sign to the Hettinger junction. Improvements will consist of widening, hot bituminous pavement overlay, ditch widening, regarding, culvert extensions, and guardrail replacement.

There is \$3710.24 in available funds for economic development. Steiner moved and Johnson seconded buying 8 loads of gravel for \$1600 to help shore up the cemetery roads.

Marlow house has been deeded over to the city. The city attorney will contact the lawyer for the judgment against the property. The demolition of the Rogers house has been started.
