

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE MOTT CITY COUNCIL**  
**October 6, 2014**

The Council met for their monthly scheduled meeting on Monday, October 6, 2014. Present were Mayor Mosbrucker, Council members Steiner, Johnson, Wangsvick and City Superintendent Mosbrucker. Messmer, and Quamme. Also present was Sheriff Sarah Warner and Wilbert Herner. All motions are carried, unless otherwise stated.

Wangsvick moved and Quamme seconded the approval of the minutes from September's meeting.

Sheriff Warner was present to discuss the 2015 policing contract. Wangsvick moved and Steiner seconded accepting a 2015 contract for 220 monthly hours of policing for a total cost of \$91,713.60

Sheriff Warner then presented the police report for September. Investigations during the month included a suicidal individual, domestic terrorizing, juvenile problems, suspicious individual, trespassing, theft of property, theft of vehicle, property damage, hit and run, and vandalism. Messmer moved and Wangsvick seconded accepting the police report as presented.

Mr. Herner was on hand to ask the city to look into rain water runoff that accumulates on his property. The city will have KLJ look into ways of diverting the runoff.

City Superintendent Mosbrucker presented his report. The city workers have been busy. They have almost completed the sewer cleaning project. There have been some challenges with large obstructions in the sewer. They have been busy getting water and sewer set up at SW Diesel's new building, Dan's Garage, and the new Roadmaster building. A street sweeper demo is set for 10/13/14. The guys plan on getting asphalt patching done before the snow flies.

Messmer moved and Wangsvick seconded a change to the employee handbook. On the first of each month the City Auditor will pay for all comp hours over 20 hours.

All utilities have been removed or capped off where the house was removed.

Discussion surrounding the County's ballot measure to increase sales tax by ½ of 1 percent with monies going to fund emergency services. The City of Mott fully supports this initiative.

The landfill will remain open for the month of October, weather providing.

The city has an air compressor that we will be taking bids on. 1958 Joy Air Compressor, sold AS IS, with an October 24th deadline for submitting bids to city hall.

The city has received a deed on a local piece of property. There is a lien against it. The city will contact the lienholder to either release the lien or to clean up the property.

Messmer moved and Johnson seconded the acceptance of the 2015 budget as presented.

Messmer moved and Johnson seconded approving the following building permits: #1807 Mott Museum of History and Art – installation of elevator; #1808 Jason Coldwell – Addition of storage shed; #1809 Donna Miller – adding a railing to the front deck.
