

PROCEEDINGS OF THE MOTT CITY COUNCIL
May 8, 2017

The Council met for their monthly scheduled meeting on Monday, May 8th, 2017. Present were Mayor Mosbrucker, Council members Messmer, Riedlinger, Wangsvick, Johnson, Steiner, Quamme and Superintendent Mosbrucker. Also present was Sheriff Warner, Lori Eggers, and Robert Keller. All motions are carried, unless otherwise stated.

Messmer moved and Wangsvick seconded the approval of the April Minutes.

Wangsvick moved and Riedlinger seconded a \$5000.00 City match for a CDBG grant to add an ADA shower to the Armory.

Steiner moved and Johnson seconded the police report as presented. April's investigation included 2 dog bites and a protection order violation.

The City Superintendent reported that they were about halfway through street tarring. Additional help would be on hand later this week to hopefully complete the job, weather permitting.

Wangsvick moved and Steiner seconded an abatement request from Bill Oberlander.

Messmer moved and Steiner seconded spending \$15,000 on a 1992 John Deere 410D backhoe for the City. With the amount spent on backhoe rental the City should have it paid for in less than 5 years.

Johnson moved and Quamme seconded the second reading of the Pet Ordinance amendments:

AMENDMENT TO THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MOTT An Ordinance to amend Chapter Eleven of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Mott, North Dakota. **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOTT, NORTH DAKOTA:** Section 1. Section 11.0203 under Article 2 of Chapter 11, Dogs and Cats, is hereby repealed in its entirety, amended, and reenacted as follows: 11.0203 License Fee The license fee shall be three dollars (\$3.00) annually for each male dog or cat and each spayed female dog or cat; six dollars (\$6.00) for each female dog or cat not spayed. The owner of any spayed female dog or cat shall present to the chief of police a letter or certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian to the effect that such dog or cat has been spayed; or such other evidence as the chief of police shall require. If the license fees as provided in this section are not paid, then an additional a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall be imposed. Section 2. Section 11.0206 under Article 2 of Chapter 11, Dogs and Cats, is hereby repealed in its entirety, amended, and reenacted as follows: 11.0206 Disposition of Unlawful Dogs or Cats Any unlicensed dog or cat or any dog or cat running at large may be taken up by any police officer and impounded at the City dog pound, or such other place as may be designated by the governing body. The dog or cat shall be held for two days. If during such period of two days the owner shall claim the animal, he shall pay the Chief of Police, the license fee and any penalty thereon required for said animal, plus the sum ten dollars (\$10.00) for the taking of said dog. If not so redeemed within two days, the official in charge of the City Pound shall destroy the animal, or in his discretion he shall be authorized to deliver the same to any person not a resident of the City of Mott upon payment of the fees for taking and keeping plus payment of the standard license fee, without penalty, for such animal. When an animal so taken shall bear a tag for a previous year from which it is possible to ascertain the owner of the animal, personal, telephoned or written notice shall be given to the owner of such animal, in order to permit him to redeem it. The Chief of Police shall be authorized whenever in his judgment it shall be practical or expedient, to give published notice of the number of dogs available at the Dog Pound for disposition as hereinbefore provided. Section 3. All other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby amended or repealed.

Riedlinger moved and Messmer seconded naming the New England Herald as the City's official paper.

The City Tour took place prior to the start of the meeting. Letters will be going out this week.
